2. Good Food on the Move: Market Mobile and Ottawa Good Food Box

Good Food on the Move: (MarketMobile and Ottawa Good Food Box) is a new grocery service where customers can place orders for affordable fresh fruits and vegetables online or over the phone. Orders will then be available for pick-up the following week at the customer's chosen time and location. Purchases must be made using a credit or debit card. Those without access to the internet are able to place an order over the phone by calling (613) 745-0073 ext. 122 every Thursday between 9am to 4pm (credit/debit cards still required.) Good Food on the Move is also offering limited free home delivery for those who are immunocompromised, senior citizens, individuals self-isolating due to illness, primary caregivers for other vulnerable individuals or those who have mobility issues. 3. Social Harvest

<u>Social Harvest</u> (SH) offers gardening programs and community engagement activities year-round, including community gardens and workshops related to the environment, urban agriculture, and food literacy. 4. Emergency Food Bank

Emergency Food Bank is open but by appointment only. We are able to serve community members from postal codes K1K and some K1M & K1G. To book an appointment, please call 613-745-0073 ext. 206 or 207 (Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday hours of 9am to 4pm). You will need to bring a proof of address within the last three months & photo ID. The health card is accepted for children 0 to 17 year of age.

- The **Food Bank <u>Delivery</u>** with Ottawa Cares is a temporary service for community members facing barriers accessing the food bank. We will be prioritizing seniors, residents with accessibility issues, and single parents with large families for deliveries. **The delivery service is available for** community members with postal codes **K1K and some K1M & K1G**. At this time, for safety reasons, volunteers cannot enter any apartment to help carry boxes inside people's homes. Deliveries are on Wednesdays and Thursdays 10:00am to noon and Thursday PM from 2:00pm to 4:00pm. If you are not at home during the delivery period, you will need to reschedule another appointment.
- The <u>Baby Cupboard</u> program is for families with children ages 0 to 3 years old with postal codes K1K and some K1M & K1G. Families are able to use this service once per month. The Baby Cupboard distributes items such as diapers, wipes, cereals and other baby items. You do not need an appointment. Drop in on **Wednesday from 1:00pm to 4:00pm**, and **Friday from 9:00am to 12:00pm**. If you have children between the ages of 0-3, please inquire about this program when booking a Food Bank order. <u>Note:</u> You will need to bring a proof of address and photo ID. The health card is accepted for children.

5. The Ottawa Mission Food Truck

The Ottawa Mission Free Food Truck is a collaboration between RRCRC and the Ottawa Mission's Food Truck in order to provide <u>free hot meals</u> to community members. The menu changes weekly. Vegetarian and meat options are available. No reservations required. This service is now available at two locations, supported by RRCRC staff and volunteers!

14. Gifts In-Kind Program

<u>Gifts In-Kind (GIK) Program</u> is a central hub, gathering donations of surplus goods and services from individuals, corporate, governmental and non-profit entities and distributing them to over 200 non-profit agencies in the city of Ottawa.
